- 17. Sensation as if brain was falling on the side laid on—Nat. sulph. (Kent, M. M.).
- 18. Cough: dry, awaking him at night and not ceasing until he sits up and passes flatus—Sang. (Allen, Keynotes).
- 19. Passage of blood from the vagina, every time the child takes the breast—Silica (Allen, 'Keynotes).

THE REMEDY was SPIGELIA 30. The disease AURICULAR FIBRILLATION.

An ex-Mason, age 65.

• Well built. Poor colour with underlying blue tint. Looks tired. For 6 months has had attacks of palpitation with a lot of "fluttering" sensation over the heart. Attacks are increasing in frequency and now come on at any time day or night. Come on suddenly and work off gradually. Attacks have no relation to exertion nor emotion. Often has shooting pain over heart area after the attack stops.

Sometimes he is wakened by attack. He changes his position for relief by lying on his back or he turns on his right side. He never lies on his left side as this brings on a choking sensation.
