The scarcity of proper healthcare is widening the gap between 'need' and 'feed' in rural India. The lack of proper facilities and low wages in rural India has made doctors reluctant to practise there. As Homeopathy is relatively inexpensive due to the government subsidies provided by The Department of Indian System of Medicine and Homeopathy [created in November 2003 and renamed Department of Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy (AYUSH) in November 2003], the primary healthcare centers in rural India should also have homeopaths, who should be incentivized to make up for the disparity in healthcare provisions.

While on a global scale, antibiotic misuse, side-effects of chemical medicines and skyrocketing cost of diagnosis and treatment are concerns affecting a majority of people. More deaths have occurred due to prescription drugs than due to heroin and cocaine combined. Also, according to L.A. Times, in US, more deaths were caused by pharmaceutical drugs than traffic accidents. Homeopathic treatment reduces antibiotic dependency and brings down the cost of hospitalization and surgeries. With the adoption of an integrated system of medicine and a homeopathy department in all hospitals, patients will be given a choice to select safe and cost-effective treatment methods.
