



## INTRODUCTION.

sulting a physician whenever it is practicable in sickness. Our little book is not intended in any way to conflict with the physicians' work. We are aware, however, that there are thousands in this country who, from notions of economy, rarely call in a doctor, but prefer to select and administer their own medicines. This class of persons unfortunately "doctor" themselves with every vile abomination offered for sale in the drug-stores and elsewhere under the name of "remedies," and it is to offer them medicines as a substitute for these, which, while they are vastly superior as curative agents, are at the same time perfectly harmless, and not one tenth the expense. Whilst we publish this little book, we make no claim to infallibility in the directions we give throughout its pages, but we can, with all confidence, assert, that one little vial of Homœopathic medicines, will, in the great majority of cases, do more good and less harm than any bottle of regular Allopathic medicine.

Homeopathic medicines, as a general thing, are *harmless*. No mistakes of poisoning can occur with our remedies; the opponents of Homeopathy laugh at this, and boldly assert that because the medicines do no harm, they are not capable of doing good, and on the principle that the more deadly the poison, the more beneficial its action, if properly given. This is a very fair sample of the ignorance and stupidity which the Allopathic school encourages.

Bread and meat, and water, and fresh air, and exercise are harmless; are they not capable of doing good?

Homeopathic medicines are cheap: they don't cost one tenth as much as Allopathic mixtures and pills, and plasters, and the like.

Homeopathic medicines are convenient ; a case of them can be kept in the house, with a domestic book, and the proper remedy selected for any case of sickness in a few minutes.

Homeopathic medicines are *efficient* and *reliable*, curing nine-tenths of the diseases for which they are properly given; and never making a sick person sicker; as is often the case in Allopathy. How often do we see a person who has, by chance, recovered from a severe spell of • sickness under Allopathic (mis)treatment, remain several weeks convalescent, or more properly, waiting patiently, while nature helped him expel the drugs from his system. The disease was gone, but the medicine remained there, holding him back.

Homeopathic medicines are *agreeable* to take; no matter how ill a person may be, our medicines will stay on the stomach, if administered according to Homeopathic principles; and are never objected to for fear of nauseating. An infant a few days old can safely take them, and children, large enough to rebel against the filthy stuff the poor little creatures too often are made to take, will gladly take Homeopathic

pills, and actually cry for them. Instinct tells those little innocent things that it is contrary to nature to swallow the abominable sickening vermifuge and other mixtures given them in Allopathic practice, and when they cry out, as they always do, they are held while it is forced down them.

Of most of the remedies in the following pages, it is to be understood that you can get a *small vial*, (for prices see back part of circular) if you wish it, at our Pharmacy, which will contain enough medicine for a thorough trial in any case.

Further on in this pamphlet we give a list of Family Medicine Cases, and Books to correspond. The very great majority of confirmed Homeeopathists keep a book and case always on hand, and would not be without them. We recommend that you keep a Case or Chest of our medicines always in your house. You get them cheaper, by buying a whole case, than by getting one vial at a time. Furthermore you can keep all your medicines together, where they can be readily gotten at when needed, and save you trouble and confusion, were you made to look around your house in different places for a remedy when you wanted it. The domestic books all contain the treatment of many more diseases than we mention in this little book, and in a more comprehensive and detailed manner. They also contain full directions for dieting during sickness, giving a list of articles allowed and articles forbidden. The larger works have chapters on domestic surgery, or the treatment of ordinary accidents, on poisoning, drowning, etc., on cold water as an aid to Homeopathic treatment, on nursing the sick, on the treatment of infants and children and mothers, on the means of preventing disease, and, in fact, on many other subjects, making them valuable beyond price to every family.

Even when you procure a large book, and case of medicines, we advise you to take care of this little manual, and keep it where you can get at it readily, as you need a remedy for any complaint you can purchase a small vial of it, and when you are through with it put it aside for future use. In time you will have a good collection and will find a medicine chest necessary.

It is best to keep Homœopathic medicines to themselves, away from all strong smelling articles, such as camphor, soap, perfumery, etc., and always keep the bottles *well corked* and away from the light.

HOMCEOPATHIC REMEDIES.

-:0:-

Homeopathic medicines can be given in *Pellets*, *Liquids* or *Powders*.

The *little pills* may be taken and allowed to dissolve in the mouth before swallowing, or, dissolve them in perfectly clear water, and give a dose of the mixture equal to six or eight of the pills. If the remedies are used in the *liquid form* (solution), five to eight drops can be mixed in a tumbler half filled with water, and *teaspoonful* or *tablespoonful* doses given. If *powders* (triturations) are used, they may be taken on the tongue or mixed with water. Size of dose, as much as will lie on the point of a pen-knife blade, about two grains.

The above doses are for *adults*; *children* should take about one-half the quantity.

The repetition of the dose depends on the urgency of the case. In *acute* diseases the medicine may be given every two to three hours; or, even every fifteen to thirty minutes in urgent cases. In *chronic* affections a dose once or twice daily is sufficient.

Furthermore it may be stated that in some cases two remedies, well selected, may be given in alternation, more or less frequently, as the case demands.

## ABSCESS.

Belladonna—When there is much swelling, pain and inflammation, every three hours six pills or two drops of liquid.

Mercurius.—When it is shiny and red, three times a day, six pills or a powder.

Apply a Bread and Milk or Linseed Poultice, and change when it becomes cold.

## APPETITE - Loss of.

China and Nux Vomica.—Without apparent derangement of the system, two to four times a day, alternately.

Nux Vomica.—If from sedentary habits, abuse of wines or liquors, every three hours.

**Pulsatilla.**—If from eating rich food, worse in the evening, a dose night and morning, pills or liquid.

### ASTHMA.

Arsenicum.—Difficult breathing, oppression of the chest and great debility, cold sweats, etc., a dose every hour, six pills, or a powder.

**Ipecacuanha**.--Fits of suffocation, constriction and rattling in the the chest, a dose every hour.

Ambrosia Artemisifolia is a valuable remedy in this disease, five drops in water every three hours.

**Phosphorus.** — Spasmodic constriction of the chest, fullness and tension of the chest, a dose every two hours, pills or liquid.

## BAD BREATH.

**Carbo Veg.**—From the abuse of mercury, gums bleeding freely, night and morning a powder.

Morcurius—From diseased gums or thrush, same as above.

**Pulsatilla** and **Nux Vomica**. — From deranged stomach, alternately four times a day.

## **BILIOUS ATTACKS.**

Nux Vomica and Podophyllum.—Pain in the stomach and side, headache, vomiting with constipation, coated tongue, nausea, every three hours, alternately.

**Pulsatilla** and **Ipecacuanha**. — Slimy or bilious diarrhœa, bitter taste, loss of appetite, vomiting food, shivering, or if caused by errors in diet, every three hours.

## **BITES of ANIMALS and STINGS of INSECTS.**

Arnica, Apis Mel., Belladonna—For internal use; a dose every half to one hour.

Ledum Pal. Tinct.—Externally; one part to five or ten parts of water. Apply with a cloth.

## BITE of RATTLESNAKE.

**Brandy or Whiskey** may be drank by the patient, a gill (four ounces) every fifteen to twenty minutes, until symptoms of intoxication are experienced.

Dr. E. A. Brown, of Hastings, Michigan, has cured a number of cases with *Iodine* tincture. He gave from *one* to *two* drops or more, every hour, according to the severity of the case.

#### BOILS.

Arnica Mont.—For small boils.

Hepar Sulph.-If slow in coming to a head.

Sulphur — When there is a constitutional susceptibility. A dose four times a day.

Dr. Springer's Healing Salve is the best application for boils, carbuncles, etc. 25 cents per box.

## **BLOOD**—Spitting of

Aconit Nap.—If the blood comes in gushes, burning pain in the chest, excited by a dry cough, etc.

China.—Great weakness, fainting, etc.

Hamamelis.—One of the most efficient remedies for Hemorrhages of all kinds.

## BRONCHITIS—Celd on the Chest.

Aconito and Bryonia.—Dry and violent cough, burning heat, constant irritation, shooting pains in the side, headache, vomiting, every two hours in alternation.

**Phosphorus.**—Dry cough from tickling in the throat, or pain in the chest, and hoarseness or loss of voice, pills or liquid four times a day.

Mercurius.--Dry and shaking cough, hoarseness, head stopped up, perspiration, every three hours a powder, or pills.

Antimonium Tart. — Wheezing, sick stomach caused by mucus accumulating, with paroxysms of cough, a powder or pills every three hours.

Kali Bichrom.—Chronic cases, tenacious, stringy mucus difficult to expectorate, a powder three times daily dry on the tongue.

BUNIONS.

**Arnica Lotion.**—Bathe the feet in warm water, and afterward apply the lotion, made by adding one part of *Tincture of Arnica*, to five parts of water. All pressure on the bunion must be avoided. The White Felt *Bunion Plasters* are excellent. 25 cents per box.

## **BURNS** and SCALDS.

Urtica or Cantharis. — Apply picked or split cotton, moistened with a lotion of the tincture, one part to ten of water. You can get a bottle of either of these at our Pharmacy, for a quarter. A cerate of Urtica or Calendula, prepared by us, is an excellent dressing for burns and scalds. If fever sets in give a few doses of *Aconite*. Tincture *Calendula* is also an excellent remedy.

## CHILBLAINS.

Arnica Tinct. diluted largely with water, and Arnica or rather Cantharis Cerate will be found serviceable applied externally.

Hamamelis Tincture.—Useful in the blue stage. Arnica and Sulphur may be used internally.

## CHILLS and FEVER, — FEVER and AGUE. INTERMITTENT FEVER.

Aconite or Gelseminum. — If fever symptoms are very severe, a dose every half hour until better.

China or Chininum Sul. (Quinine)—If nausea and thirst *before* the fever, headache, thirst between the cold and hot stages, or after the hot stage, no thirst during the heat, great debility, fevers with regular type.

Fever heat, with fulness of head, etc., yellow complexion, a dose every two hours, powder or liquid. Of *Quinine*; the  $\frac{1}{2}$  or 1 grain pills may also be used in the same manner. (Quinine, as well as all the other preparations of *Peruvian Bark*, are remedies of high value in the treatment of *Malarial* diseases).

**Arsenicum.**—If great debility, disposition to vomit, or violent stomach pains, drinking very often, pains in the limbs or all over the body with anxiety and restlessness, nausea, bitter taste in the mouth, a powder every two hours.

**Ipecacuanha** and **Pulsatilla.**—If much shivering with little heat, or the contrary, no thirst, disordered stomach, vomiting and other gastric derangements, a dose alternately every two hours.

Nux Vomica. — If there is constipation, and the chills come on daily in the evening or night, with pain in the forehead, vertigo, and bitter taste, great weakness, six pills every two hours.

**Canchalagua.** — The great South American remedy, prepared from the Chili Gentian, is almost a specific for chills and fever. The dose is only two or three drops of the tincture in a little water. A small vial can be had for a quarter. We know of many very obstinate cases cured with this remedy.

**Eucalyptus Globulus.**—Another very valuable medicine. A tinctute prepared from the Australian "Fever Tree." Five drop doses of the tincture every three hours in water. This tree, planted in a low, marshy, unheathy locality will purify the atmosphere and drive away miasmatic diseases. The English Government has planted thousands in localities where its soldiers are stationed, exposed to unhealthy atmospheres, and chills have entirely disappeared.

In addition to the above remedies we call special attention to Munson & Co.'s Fever and Ague Pills and Drops, which will cure the disease in all its stages. Many thousands have tested them, and they would not be without this remedy.—Price 25 cents.

## CHOLERA — Asiatic.

We give below the remedies and their indication. The usual dose of six or eight pills or two drops of liquid, or a little powder is to be given. Send for a good Homœopathic Doctor as soon as you find the slightest indication of Cholera, and tell him what remedy you have taken before he arrived.

During the prevalence of Cholera, *every* diarrhœa, however light, should receive prompt attention. If possible, go to bed, and remain there until entirely well. If diarrhœa comes on at night never wait till morning to treat it, but select a remedy at once. If taken in time

our remedies will *always* cure ; and thousands of hopeless cases, abandoned by Allopaths, are cured by our doctors.

Aconite — *ist Dil. or Mother Tincture*, in drop doses every fifteen minutes, during the early stage of the disease. Great pain in the bowels, coldness of the body, etc.

**Camphora.**—On the first symptoms of Cholera, diarrhœa, chilliness, and spasmodic pains in the abdomen. loss of strength when the skin becomes very cold, etc., a dose every fifteen minutes, a few drops of the strong tincture on sugar.

Verat. Alb. -- Violent and profuse discharges of rice-water-like fluids, vomiting, with thirst for cold water, cramps, etc.

Cuprum Met.—Cramps, either with or without vomiting.

The Vienna Cholera Drops have been used with wonderful success in several Cholera epidemics. Nobody should be without this valuable remedy. Price 35 cents per bottle.

## CHOLERA MORBUS.

Ipecacuanha and Veratrum Alb — Every half hour, alternately, when the vomiting is severe, usual dose of pills or liquid.

**Arsenicum** --If violent pains in the stomach, great thirst, diarrhœa, vomiting of watery, or bilious slimy substance, a powder or pill every half hour. The *Camphor Anodyne* is also an excellent remedy.

## CHRONIC CATARRH.

Kali Bichom.—With hoarseness, ulcerated or inflamed sore throat, cough, two doses a day.

Aurum Mur.—Nose swollen and inflamed, sore to touch, discharge of offensive matter, &c.

Sulphur or Hepar Sulphur.—With a free dischargé, twice daily. Use Cutler's Pocket Inhaler.

## COLD or CATARRH.

Nux Vomica.—For dry cold with headache, obstruction of the nose, stuffed feeling in the head, aching in the limbs, constipation, every two hours pills or liquid.

Quilaya Saponaria.—A New Remedy and Preventive for Colds, Cold in the Head, &c. Dose: four pills twice daily when subject to colds. Price 25 cents.

**Arsenicum.** — For loose or running cold, if the discharge is thin and acrid, with nausea and prostration, four times a day, six pills or a powder.

Mercurius or Hepar Sulph.—For sneezing, running of mucus from the nose, soreness of the nose, discharge thick, a powder four times a day. Pulsatilla.—For offensive, yellow or green secretion, with loss of smell and taste, every four hours, pills or liquid.

## COLIC-Belly-Ache.

**Colocynth** or **Nux Vomica.**—From Biliousness. **Nux Vomica** or **China**.—From a Chill. **Chamomilla, Colocynth, China** or **Nux**.—Flatulent colic.

Anodyne Camphor on sugar gives prompt relief.

## CONSTIPATION.

Bryonia.—In summer time, or from disordered stomach, with headache, pills or liquid.

Mercurius.— For bad taste, sick headache, or bilious symptoms, pills or powders.

Nux Vomica.—For hard, knotty stools, with much straining, headache, vertigo, pills or liquid.

Sulphur and Nux Vom. — For chronic constipation, with piles, twice a day.

**Podophyllin**—For obstinate cases, where the bowels must be moved at once, in pills or powder every two or three hours.

**Hydrastis Can.** -- Obstinate constipation. A valuable remedy in many cases. 1st 2d or 3d Trituration, a dose every night.

## **CONVULSIONS IN CHILDREN.**

**Belladonna.**—Convulsions, with determination of blood to the brain or inflammation.—Two drops of a *low dilution* every fifteen minutes for several times

**Hyoscyamus**.—Rolling of the head and twitching of the face foaming of the mouth, &c.

**Opium.**—Lethargy, tremor, stupor, heavy breathing, &c. Ignatia is also a valuable remedy.

Send for a Homceopathic Physician as soon as possible, but before his arrival resort to the above remedies.

An injection of water and milk, or sweet oil and milk may be given in most cases.

## CORNS.

Corns can only be eradicated by wearing easily-fitting boots and shoes. When Corns appear, the surrounding skin should be softened with warm water, the hard head of the corn extracted with the finger nail or some

instrument, and the thickened skin pared off with a sharp knife. Then apply

**Tincture** of **Arnica.**—One part to five of water; or *Arnica* Court Plaster. The White Felt *Corn Plasters* having a hole in the center are excellent. 25 cents per box.

The Tinct. of Thuja, painted on the corn, twice daily, will often eradicate it.

## COUGHS.

Aconite.—Short, dry cough, with irritation, and fever, etc.

Belladonna.-Spasmodic cough, worse at night-

Bryonia.—Suffocative cough, Vomiting of food, stitches in the side and pain in the chest.

Ipecac or Tartar Emetic.—Suffocative feeling, as from accumulation and rattling of mucus, cold, sweating face, etc.

**Phosphorus.**—Dry cough, with tickling in the throat, pains in chest, etc., also cough with expectoration.

Lachesis.—Cough at night, excited by pressure on the throat.

Rumex Crispus.—Dry cough, with tickling in the throat. Hoarseness, with pressure in the throat, pit, etc. The 3rd, 6th and 30th potencies are used.

Sticta Pulm.—Cough, with sneezing; dry noisy cough.

Munson & Co.'s Croup and Cough Syrup will cure many coughs, Acute and Chronic, when other remedies fail.

#### CROUP.

Aconite.—During the inflammatory stage.

Hepar Sul.—If the croup is attended with rattling of mucus, cough moist, etc.

**Spongia**—Hoarse, hollow, barking and crowing cough, slow, loud wheezing and saving breathing, or fits of choking. *Aconite* may be given alternately with either remedy, every five, ten, fifteen or thirty minutes.

Munson & Co.'s Croup and Cough Syrup controls this terrible disease readily, and will give prompt relief in the severest cases.

#### DIARRHŒA.

Arsenicum.—Watery or slimy or brownish evacuations. Great debility, violent thirst at night, after midnight, etc.

Bryonia.—If in the heat of Summer. From cold drinks, etc.

Chamomilla.—Watery or slimy bilious, especially in children.

China. — Undigested or Brownish stools, with great weakness, etc.

**Ipecac.**—Slimy, yellow Diarrhœa. Good for *Diarrhœa of children*. **Veratrum Alb.**—Diarrhœa with great weakness. A dose every half, one, two or three hours.

## DIPTHERIA.

Belladonna, Phytolacca— Mild simple cases. Severe inflammation of throat and fever, (*Apis mel.*) Also serviceable when Diptheria appears during Scarlet fever.

Mercur Bijodat—In the more malignant forms, where there is considerable fetor of the breath, and the symptoms decidedly adynamic, 2d Trituration, I grain every hour for four doses, then every two or three hours.

**Baptisia**—Typhoid symptoms; also for sensation of great fullness, cedematous swelling of the affected parts, affection of the posterior opening of the nose, little pain or soreness of the fauces, much swelling of the glands, great difficulty in swallowing, very weak murmur of respiration heard all over the chest, violent spells of suffocation.

Kali Bich., Acid Muriatic, or Arsenicum Jod. alternate with Ammon Carb. — Malignant cases, with great prostration and severe typhoid condition.

**Carbolic Acid**—Where the exudate is imbeded in the mucus membrane, and fector oris present, 1-3 drops, (1st or 2d dil.) in water every two or three hours, and before each dose swab the affected parts with diluted alcohol. When given in cases of children who cannot gargle, the mouth and fauces should be painted several times a day with a solution of 8-10 drops of the tincture to one glass of water. Those who can should gargle with it every hour. Weak solutions operate better than strong ones.

**Calcar.** Chlor.—It has often been prescribed because it has answered the whole pathological state, as well as the symtomathology of these cases. *Chloride of Lime* has been used both internally and externally.

Lig. Calc. Chlorin -8-10 drops in half glass water, one teaspoonful every half to two hours. A gargle, I teaspoonful to  $\frac{2}{3}$  of water, should only be used when there is a great amount of diphtheritic deposit. It removes the membrane rapidly.

Mercur. Cyan.--3, 6, 12 and 30th potencies mostly used. According to Villiers, in all cases of epidemic diptheritis, indications wanting. Extraordinary results have been attained with this grand remedy.

## DYSENTERY.

Arsonicum.—Involuntary evacuations, great debility, etc.

**Ipecae.**—Bilious stools, bloody mucus, Dysentery occuring in Autumn.

Morcur Corr.—Violent straining, discharge of pure blood, etc. 8rd Trituration. Sulphur—In desperate cases, blood-streaked mucus, violent straining. Petroleum. — Dysenteric Diarrhœa, consisting of bloody mucus, much pressing to stool, etc.

LeptandraVirg-Mucus, bloody stool or tar-like fotid discharge, etc.

## DYSPEPSIA.

Bryonia.—Frequent eructations. Inability to bear tight pressure of the clothes, loathing of food, Constipation, etc.

China.—Drowsiness, fulness and distension. Weak digestion. Great debility.

Nux Vom.—Regurgitation of food, dullness of the head, giddiness, heartburn, constipation, vomiting of food, if caused of spiritous liquors, etc.

**Pulsatilla.**—Eructations, tasting of food, waterbrash, Nausea, or if caused by fat things, etc.

Any one or two of the above remedies may be taken two or four times daily.

### EARACHE.

Belladonna.—Tearing and shooting pains, extending to the throat.

**Mercurius**—Shooting pains, with chilly feeling in the ears, worse by warmth in bed, etc.

Hepar Sul.—For thick or fœtid discharge from the ears, etc. Pulsatilla.—Redness, swelling and heat of the external ear, etc.

## ERYSIPELAS.

Aconitum Nap.—Before the rash appears, but may be given when there are febrile symptoms.

**Belladonna**—Severe bright red eruption, with headache, thirst, constipation, thick urine, etc. In alternation with *Aconite*.

Rus Tox -- Vesicles on the face or body, with swelling, shiny redness, and restlessness.

**Cantharis**—Much irritation, burning, and serous exudation. *Cantharis Tincture* applied externally, is an excellent remedy. A teaspoonful to a tumbler of water, applied with cloths constantly wet with the solution.

## **EYES**—Inflammation of the

Aconite.-Eyelids swollen, hard and red, with dryness.

Belladonna.—Margins are turned up, external surface inflamed, etc. Euphrasia—Lids red, swollen, and covered with yellow acrid discharge, etc.

Pulsatilla-Inflammatory redness of the margins, stye on eye-lid, etc.

**Dr. Bernreuter's Eye Salve** is one of the most reliable preparations for sore and inflamed eyes. For weak and inflamed eyes, a mild lotion of *Ruta Tinct*. can be recommended.

## HEADACHE.

Belladonna. — Violent pressing pains, as if the head would split open, pains above the eyes, sensibility to noise, motion or light.

Bryonia. -- Compressive sensation in the head, shootings on one side, aggravated by motion.

Ipecac.—With nausea and Vomiting, etc.

Nux Vomica.—Great heaviness of the nead when moving the eyes and thinking; sensations as if the skull would bust, when caused by indigestion, etc.

Atropin and Glonoin are valuable medicines in headache. The latter remedy in dull, heavy headache, with profuse secretion of tears, relieved by sleep.

Iris Versicolor.—Violent pains over the eye, on either side; severe pains through left eye, with nausea and vomiting.

In many cases of headache, *pressure* will relieve. A wet bandage should be tightly bound around the head, or even a handkerchief may answer the purpose.

## **HICCOUGH.**

Nux Vomica will give prompt relief in many cases.

**Caulophyllin** is a most powerful anti-spasmodic, for *adults* or *infants*. A powder of the 2x or 3x trit. every 10 or 20 minutes.

Cold Water; taken in small draughts, with the head thrown backwards, will often give relief.

#### **HOARSENESS.**

Belladonna.—Tenacious mucus in the chest, with great soreness, redness and dryness of the larynx. Voice weak and very hoarse.

**Phosphorus.** — Roughness of the throat, violent catarrh, with hoarseness, etc.

Mercurius—Loss of voice, worse in the evening, throat feels dry, etc.

**Phytolaeca.**—Complete or chronic loss of voice. For Clergymen, Speakers and Singers.

Munson's & Co.'s Cough Lozenges can be highly recommended, as a prompt remedy for hoarseness. 25 cents per box.

## **KIDNEYS**—Inflammation of the

**Cantharis.**—Shooting, tearing, with painful discharge of urine by drops; urine mixed with blood, cramp-like pains in the bladder.

**Pulsatilla**.—Bloody urine, with purulent sediment, when accompanied with suppressed or scanty menstruation in females, etc.

**Terebinthina.**—Vesical inflammation, congestion of the Kidneys, bloody urine, suppressed or scanty.

## LEUCORRHŒA—Whites.

Calcarea Carb. — Burning, itching discharge, like milk, flowing be fore the menses, etc.

Sulphur.—Corrosive or yellowish discharge, preceded by cutting pains around the navel, etc.

Helonias Dioica.—Has peculiar virtues as a *uterine tonic* Chlorosis, with indigestion and debility; Leucorrhœa, with relaxation of the womb, etc.

### LUMBAGO.

Bryonia.—Pains worse during motion.

Nux Vom.--Accompanied with indigestion or constipation Weak ness in the back.

**Rhus Tox.**—If caused by exposure to wet or suppressed perspiration, etc. Give a dose every three hours of the indicated remedy, either single or in alternation.

#### MEASLES.

Aconite.—Fever, sleeplessness, dread of light, short, dry and hollow cough in the early stage of the disease.

Belladonna.—Sore throat, pain in the forehead, delirium, violent thirst, etc.

Bryonia.—Pains in the limbs, cough and stitches in the chest.

**Pulsatilla.**—In almost every stage of the disease. To facilitate the eruption, inflammation of the ear. Dread of light.

Ammonium Carb. will assist in developing the eruption.

## **MENSTRUATION**--Profuse.

China.--Great weakness, gushing at intervals, with spasmodic pains. **Ipecacuanha.**--Where the discharge is profuse and continued, flooding, etc.

Calcarea Carb.—In obstinate cases.

Nux Vom.—Spasms in abdomen, nausea and fainting. A dose of the selected remedy every two hours until better.

## MENSTRUATION-Suppressed.

Aconite.—In young girls who lead a sedentary life. In pletoric persons, or if from fright, etc.

**Pulsatilla.**--Nausea, colic, pains in the small of the back, discharge of black, coagulated blood, sour vomiting, etc. From getting wet or catching cold. Leucorrhœa in individuals of a mild disposition, etc.

Senecio Aureus.—An excellent remedy, in many cases, of difficult menstruation.

Belladonna.—Pressing down in the abdomen as if everything would press out, colic and cloudiness of sight preceding the menses.

Nux Vom.—Forcing pains, nausea, with fainting, congestion of blood to the head, giddiness, great debility, etc.

Sulphur.—Pressive headache, especially at the back part of the head. Great langour in the lower limbs, feeling of fullness and weight in the stomach, etc.

## **NEURALGIA.**

Aconite.—Intolerable pains, especially at night, great sensibility of the nervous system, etc.

Arnica Mont.—Aching, bruised pains, worse by the least exertion or noise, etc.

Belladonna.—Shooting, burning pains, worse by motion, light, etc. Cutting pains when rubbing the parts.

Nux Vomica.—Drawing and jerking pains, worse in the open air.

Gratiolo Offic.—Is useful when Neuralgia is attributed to the prolonged abuse of coffee.

Sulphuric Acid.—When Neuralgia comes on gradually and leaves off suddenly.

Spigelia. -- Neuralgia in the face; good in cold, damp weather, etc.

## **NOSE—Bleeding of.**

Aconit Nap. or Bryonia.—Violent bleeding. If from being overheated, etc.

Arnica Mont. —If from physical exertion, contusion, or a blow.

China.-Violent bleeding. For debilitated persons.

Calcar Carb. - Disposition to bleed from the nose.

Any of the above remedies may be given every fifteen to twenty minutes in *acute* cases. For *chronic* cases, once or twice daily.

## PALPITATION OF THE HEART.

Aconite.--With great heat, chiefly in the face, and weariness of limbs, etc.

Belladonna.—Violent throbbings in the chest and heart, etc.

**Cactus Grand**.—Constriction, or dull, heavy pain in the heart. Palpitation and Rheumatism of the heart, etc.

## PILES.

Aesculus Hippo-Acute or chronic piles, protruding with constipation, pain in the back, etc.

Nux Vom.—For blind and bleeding piles, in persons who use much coffee and spirits, constipation, bruised pain in the back, patient is unable to raise himself. Disposition to piles, etc.

Sulphur—Constipation, alternating with discharges of bloody mucus, frequent protrusion of piles.

Collinsonia Can.—Piles without bleeding, Constipation or diarrhœa, Vicarions, discharge from the blood-vessels.

Cerates of Aesculus and Hamamelis, also Hamamelis Extract are the best remedies externally.

## PIMPLES OF THE FACE.

Calcarea.—If humid and scaly.

Nux Vom.—Pricking, burning and itching, from abuse of wine, spirits, etc.

Sulphur. — Itching, pustulous eruptions, accompanied with chronic dyspepsia and constipation, 3, 6 or 30x Trituration. A dose every night, or two remedies may be taken in alternation. All external applications are injurious.

#### PLEURISY.

Bryonia and Arnica. -- In alternation every two hours, two drops in water.

## PNEUMONIA.

Aconite. - In the first and second stages, fever, thirst and heat.

Bryonia.—Cough, with shooting pains in the chest, expectoration of slimy or bloody mucus.

**Phosphorus.** — Sensation as if the chest was raw; great oppression and cough.

**Veratrum Viride**.--Relieves the congested lungs rapidly, if accompanied with *cerebro-spinal* irritation.

## RHEUMATISM.

Bryonia.—Tearing, shooting pains in the muscles, worse on movement, swelling of the affected part, etc.

Rhus Tox.—Wrenching pains and paralytic weakness, worse during rest.

**Caulophyllin**. — Pain and swelling in the wrists and fingers, with sleeplessness, use 3x Trituration or 2x Dilution CAULOPHYLLUM.

**Cimicifuga**.— Good for crick in the back, with sciatica, acute rheumatism of the back and shoulders. *Colchicum* is also a good remedy. (See the article on *Propylamin*.)

## RINGWORM.

**Rhus Tox** and **Sulphur**. — In alternation, a dose night and morning. Externally, apply the *Phytolacca Cerate*.

## SORE THROAT.

Belladonna. — Shooting in the throat, contraction and spasmodic constriction of the fauces, inability to swallow, swollen glands, etc.

Lachesis. -- Constant desire to swallow, with spasms or sensation as if a lump was sticking in the throat, etc.

Mercurius Jodat Ruber. -- 2x or 3x Trituration. Violent shootings extending to the ear, redness of the parts, salivation. An excellent remedy.

Arum Tryphyllum.--Inflammation of the tonsils and clergyman's sore throat.

Phytolacca Dec.--Thick, white swelling of the palate and tonsils, coating on the tongue.

## SLEEPLESSNESS.

**Gelseminum.**—Wakefulness alone, two or three drops of the tincture at bedtime.

Nux Vomica -- 3x trituration, is the best remedy for sleeplessness caused by abuse of liquor.

Senecio Aureus — Has proved curative in obstinate sleeplessness or restless, uneasy sleep. At the climacteric or critical age in women, it is useful.

Stramonium.—From excessive thinking, reading, etc. Ignatia. If from grief, etc.

## TEETHING OF INFANTS.

Aconite. For fever, restlessness, etc.

**Chamomilla.**—When the child has colic, is fretful and excited, redness, of cheeks or only of one cheek, etc.

Calcarea Carb.—Slow and difficult teething, obstinate diarrhœa, for scrofulous or weakly children, etc.

Kreosotum. — Dentition of delicate children for fretful, irritable temper, etc.

## TOOTHACHE.

Aconite and Mercurius Viv.—In alternation, if caused by a cold. Shooting pains in hollow teeth, pains extending to the ears and head.

Chamomilla.—Intolerable pains, especially at night in bed, worse from warmth, etc.

Chelidonium Majus.—Dull pain in the teeth of the left upper or lower jaw when touched.

Gelseminum.—Caries of the teeth, with Neuralgic pains in the face and jaws. Smelling on the Tincture of *Staphysagria* will give prompt relief in many cases.

**Plantago Major.**—2nd dilution. This is one of the grandest remedies for toothache. A dose of two drops every 15 or 30 minutes until relieved.

## TETTERS—Herpes.

Arsenic Alb.-- Tetters having a red, unhealthy appearance with blisters and burning.

Calcarea Carb.--Bran-like tetters, which quickly reappear.

Rhus Tox.—With pains in the chest, burning, itching, etc.

Sulphur .-- Itching in the evening, spreading.

Iris Vers.--1x dilution has proved successful.

Lycopersicum.--Affords prompt relief in inveterate tetter. Exter nally, the *Lycopersicum cerate* may be applied.

## **URINE**—Retention of

Cantharis.--Cutting and tearing pains, urging to urinate, etc.

Terebinthina, Phosphoric Acid--are remedies often required.

Pulsatilla --- For children and in females.

Chimaphilla Umbelata.—Scanty urine, containing a large quantity of muco, purulent sediment.

## **URINE**—Incontinence of

[WETTING OF THE BED IN CHILDREN.

Benzoic Acid.—1x dilution, two drops in water every four hours while awake, has cured many cases.

**Equisetum Hyemale**—has been successfully employed in Enuresis (wetting the bed). It is given in the 1x dilution, one to two drops in water every three hours for two or three days. Other remedies used: *Cantharis, Hyoscyamus, Sepis*, etc.

## WARTS.

#### The greatest remedy is:

**Thuya Occidentalis.**--The warts should be painted two or three times daily with the *mother tincture* externally. *Thuya* may be taken internally morning and night, a dose 3rd or 6th potency. When Thuya does not succeed, use *Rhus tox* in the same manner.

Sulphur.—A dose every night is an excellent remedy for numerous and obstinate warts.

## WHOOPING COUGH.

Belladonna. -- Spasmodic cough, with marked head symptoms, vomiting and bleeding from nose and mouth.

**Drosera.**—When fully developed, with vomiting of food and mucus, etc.

**Corrallia Rubra.**--In the 3x *Trituration* or 6th *Dilution* is a valuable remedy in all stages of whooping cough.

**Laurocerasus.**—Spasmodic cough with whistling sound, but without expectoration in the latter stages.

**Castanea Vesca.**— Is a valuable remedy. Give the tincture five drop doses in water.

**Mephitis Putorius**—is one of the most valuable remedies in all stages of whooping cough.

#### WORMS.

Cina or Santonine.—(1x Trituration.) Discharge of pin worms, hardness of abdomen, livid circles around the eyes, grinding teeth during sleep, etc.

Sulphur.--In chronic cases, disposition to have worms.

Worm Lozenges, containing Santonine, are also very convenient for use. 25cts. per box.



## THE MOST IMPORTANT HOMEOPATHIC REMEDIES, AND THEIR LEADING INDICATIONS IN DISEASE.

Aconitum Napellus.—The prominent uses of Aconitum are as follows: All feverish and inflammatory affections, chiefly at their commencement, and often during their course. Thirst, and dry, hot skin; chills and shiverings, succeeded by burning heat; strong rapid pulse; restlessness, anxiety, flushing of the face; pain; quick or labored breathing; dry cough. with fever; first stage of cold-in-the-head; etc. It probably surpasses all other known remedies in its power of controlling the circulatory system, and triumphantly supersedes the lancet and leech. Had Hahnemann's labors been limited to the discovery and demonstration to the wide curative power of this great remedy, they would have entitled him to the gratitude of countless myriads of his fellow-creatures in every succeeding generation. He most appropriately ranks it as first and foremost in his Materia Medica, not because its name begins with the first letter of the alphabet, but because of its transcendent power and extended sphere of action; he terms it a precious plant, whose efficacy almost amounts to a miracle.

Antimonium Tartaricum. — Tartarus Emeticus.. — The chief sphere of action of this medicine lies in the mucous membranes, the lungs, and the skin. Clinical experience has amply proved its value in certain inflammations involving those parts, especially in Catarrhal Croup, Bronchitis, and Pneumonia.

On the skin it causes a pustular eruption resembling that of *Small*-Pox. It also produces vomiting, and that peculiar alteration of the blood, which are characteristic of Small-pox. As it might be supposed, then, *Ant.-Tart*. has been found a remedy of the first importance in this disease, and if timely used, scarcely requires the aid of any other medicine.

Apis Melifica. — Rapid swelling (ædematous) of various parts; Erysipelas, with great ædema; Nettle-rash, itching-stinging eruptions, with swelling; stings; frequent urging and inability to pass water, Dropsy after Scarlet fever; etc.

Arnica Montana. — Its chief uses are — in affections resulting from *injuries*, tingling of the skin, convulsive and spasmodic affections, Lockjaw, active discharges of blood, vomiting and spitting of blood, and

other complaints from *bruises*, *falls*, etc; severe concussions; pains, supposed to be rheumatic, from long, heavy physical toil; concussion of the brain; rheumatic pains; stitch in the side; fatigue: Chilblains; swelling of the breast, soreness of the nipple, etc.

**Arsenicum**.—*Cold, Influenza, Asthma*, Bronchitis; *fevers*—Intermittent, Typhoid, and putrid, with great thirst, *debility*, etc; *Cholera*, in the more violent forms of the malady; diseases of the stomach and bowels, especially when accompanied by *great prostration* or *burning pains*; *Diarrhæa*, with watery, green or dark, burning motions; skin diseases, particularly those of a scaly nature; old or obstinate Ulcers, with a bloody, thin, or fœtid discharge; and dropsical complaints.

**Belladonna.**-This medicine almost ranks in importance with *Aconite*, in inflammatory diseases, characterized by bright-redness of the parts, pain, intolerance of light and sound, and other brain symptoms. It is often required after Aconite, or in alternation with it; Sore throat with redness and sense of rawness; Toothache with throbbing and congested face; complaints marked by congestion in the head, or with Convulsions, Neuralgia and Delirium. Affections of the *Brain* and nervous system; eruptive fevers, especially simple Scarlatina and Erysipelas (not vesicular); violent Headache; rheumatic inflammations with hot swellings, and swollen glands. Its power in *preventing* attacks of epidemic Scarlatina, as well as of curing that disease, has been abundantly established by facts.

**Bryonia.** — Pleurisy, Pneumonia, dry, severe, cough; cold-in-thechest; stitches, and shooting pains in the chest, increased by coughing, a deep inspiration or even movement; derangements of the liver and bowels; Lumbago, Sciatica, Rheumatism of the joints, and all rheumatic affections; bilious headaches; Jaundice, etc. The prominent *Gastric* symptoms are — water-brash; bitter or sour risings; pressure on the stomach, or sensation as if a stone were there; and constipation from inertia of the bowels.

**Calcarea Carbonica.** — This remedy is chiefly used in scrofulous, rickety, and tuberculous affections. Glandular swelling of the neck and abdomen; effuptions around the eyes, and agglutination of the lids; difficult or delayed dentition, with heat and swelling of the gums; chronic Diarrhœa; incipient consumption of the bowels; swelling of the messenteric glands; emaciation; diseases of females, when the menses appear too soon and are too abundant; sterility; Leucorhœa; 'chronic headache; also in inveterate and obstinate diseases of the bones (*Rachitis*) and skin.

**Camphor, Homeopathic Tincture of.** — This remedy is valuable in the *invasive stage of Influenza* (when its administration will often

terminate the complaint); Malignant Cholera, in the incipient stage of the disorder; excessive sudden prostration of the nervous system from any cause; fainting and dizziness; cramps in the arms, legs or abdomen; severe purging. "It is antidotal to almost all the drastic vegetable poisons; relieves Strangury; procures reaction from cold, congested conditions; is the great anti-choleraic; and quiets nervous irritability. This is its whole clinical value—and a great one it is—in a nutshell." In sudden attacks, two drops on a small piece of loaf sugar, repeated every fifteen or twenty minutes, for three or four times; in Cholera, four drops, administered in the same manner, every ten, fifteen, or twenty minutes. In consequence of its volatile properties, it should be kept separate from all other Homœopathic remedies.

**Cantharis.**—Affections of the *urinary* organs; pain in the loins; soanty, scalding, and even bloody urine; tenderness about the bladder; Strangury; suppression of urine from acute congestion, etc.

**Carbo Vegetabilis** —Affections of the *digestive organs*, with oppression after eating; flatulent distention of the stomach, with acidity or heartburn; tendency to Diarrhœa; Piles; Worms; hoarseness, loss of voice, and sensitiveness to the variations of weather; chronic Nettlerash; unhealthy, burning, fœted ulcers. *Carbo Vegetabilis* counteracts the injurious consequences of Mercury and Quinine.

**Chamomilla.** — Diseases of children and women; *Convulsions*, arising from teething, anger, or pain in the bowels; Neuralgia, with tearing, dragging, and lancinating pains; Toothache, tearing and stitching, with swelling of the cheeks, and a feeling as if the teeth were elongated; *Difficult dentition*, when one of the cheeks is red and hot, the gums swollen and sensitive; the child irritable, and convulsions are indicated; *Diarrhæa of Children*, from cold or teething, when the motions are watery, sliny, green or yellow; dentition-fever, with crossness, restlessness, and irregular circulation, one cheek being hot, the other cold; *Catarrhal* cough of children, with hoarseness and rattling of mucus in the throat. Also, for the consequences of passion, when pain seems to be intolerable, owing to the extreme sensitiveness of the patient.

**China, or Cinchona.**—(From which *Quinine* is prepared.)—Weakness, with easy perspiration consequent on exhaustive discharges—loss of blood, Diarrhœa, prolonged nursing, sexual excesses, etc; Intermittent and other miasmatic fevers. It is specific to many forms of fevers of a periodic type; debility marked by disposition to sweat; exhausting night sweats; Summer Diarrhœa, when the discharges are slimy, bilious or mixed with undigested food; loss of appetite; bilious taste; flatulence; Jaundice; enlargement of the spleen; debilitating seminal emissions (*Spermatorrhœa*) from sexual vices.

**Cimicifuga**, (or Actae) **Racemosa**.—*Rheumatic* affections, especially where there are uterine difficulties or irregularities; "nervousness;" pains in the left side below the breast in females; crick-in-the-back; headache, with aching pains in the eye-balls; palpitation of the heart; sinking at the stomach; Amenorrhœa, Dysmenorrhœo, and Menorrhagia; disorders of pregnancy and the critical age, etc.

**Cina.** — Homeopathic to the condition which produces intestinal parasites, especially *thread-worms*, indicated by picking of the nose, grinding of the teeth, convulsions and spasms, voracious appetite, alternating with poor appetite, itching at the seat, diarrheetic motions, discharge of worms, wetting the bed; hoarse, hollow cough in children, and other symptoms from enverminous affections.

**Coffea.**—Morbid sensitiveness and irritability of the nervous system, especially the effects of joy; fretfulness and wakefulness of children; nervous toothache; nervous sufferings of highly excitable children or hysterical women.

**Colocynthis.**—This drug has not a wide range of action, and is chiefly prescribed for griping, flatulent Colic, with diarrhœtic evacuations; Neuralgia, Sciatica, etc.

**Cuprum.**—Derangements of the nervous system, cramps, convulsive movements, etc; St. Vitus dance; Epilepsy, with violent Convulsions, paleness of the face, dizziness, and great debility; general nervous affections accompanied by spasm and emaciation; cramps and vomiting of Cholera; extreme pain in the bowels, with prostration, sallow complexion, and vomiting; some cases of Hooping-cough; etc.

**Drosera**.—*Hooping-cough*, with suffocative symptoms, vomiting or bleeding from the nose, especially when the "hoop" has become fully developed, and after the use of *Ipecacuanha* and *Belladonna*; also in spasmodic cough generally.

**Dulcamara.**—Various affections—Cold in the head, nausea; Catarrh of the bladder, mucous Diarrhœa, etc. — from damp or a thorough wetting; conditions following a cold. If taken immediately after exposure to damp, *Dulcamara* will often prevent the consequences of a cold.

Gelseminum Sempervirens.—This drug is one of the new American remedies, has a sphere of action apparently midway between that of *Acon*. and *Bell*. Under the *nervous* system, it is useful in—nervous shiverings without chilliness; languor, etc., from night watching; neuralgic face-ache, with twitchings of the muscles near the affected part; simple sleeplessness of children, or from mental excitement. In Scarlatina it is useful when *Acon*. or *Bell*. fails to bring out the eruption bright. especially in young children; also in this and other fevers when there is a tendency to remittency. Dull heaviness in the head, and dizziness; pure nervous toothache—(applied locally); many ailments of children during teething, as sleeplessness, pain with sudden outcries; Spasm of the glottis, etc.

**Hamamelis.**—Varicose veins; Hemorrhage of the veins; painful and bleeding Piles; tendency to hemorrhage from various parts.

Hepar Sulphuris Calcarea. — This is a compound of Sulphur and Calcarea and has resemblance to each, influencing the skin like Sulphur and the glands like Calcarea. It has also an action differing from either of these remedies separately. It is chiefly prescribed in inflammatory affections of the wind-pipe and air-passages; croup, wheezing breathing, hoarseness; consumptive coughs, etc. Abscesses; Scaldhead; salivation, and other consequences from large doses of Mercury. Like Silicea, but to a less extent, it favors the suppurative process.

**Ignatia.**—This remedy is valuable for the consequences of *grief*, in persons, females particularly, of a highly sensitive temperament; nervous headache; hysteric, convulsive, or spasmodic disorders, disappointment, or ill-humor, with the sensation of a ball rising in the throat, (*globus hystericus*); nervous affections of girls at puberty, and women at the critical period; convulsive affections of infants and children from worms; prolapsus ani, etc.

**Ipecacuanha.**—Chiefly useful in affections of the respitory and digestive organs. Spasmodic, suffocative cough; bleeding from the nose; Spasmodic-asthma; Hooping-cough, during the spasmodic stage, hay-fever, and some varieties of bronchitis. Derangements of the digestive organs, characterized by simple nausea and vomiting, with or without diarrhœa; colic, with loose, fermented, or dysenteric stools, especially in children.

Kali Bichromicum.—Affections of the mucus membranes and the skin. On the respiratory mucus lining it has great power, especially in chronic brochitis, with much tough, stringy mucus, difficult to expectorate; cough with wheezing, difficult breathing; chronically ulcerated throat; hoarseness; chronic catarrh; croup; polypus in the nose. It is curative in catarrhal and strumous ophthalmia, and in syphilitic affections of the eye. An additional indication for its use is a simultaneous affection of the respiratory and digestive mucous membrane.

Lycopodium.—Atonic affections of the digestive organs; pain, sensitiveness, or distention of the abdomen; waterbrash; chronic constipation; gravel and stone; moist eruptions; scald-head; glandular swellings; scrofulous ulcers; loss of hair.

**Mercurius.**—There are various preparations of *Mercury* used in Homœopathy; but in this Guide we have chiefly referred to two, as under:

1st. MERCURIUS SOLUBILIS, or VIVUS. — This remedy is prescribed for: Clandular affections, with swelling and sometimes suppuration; sore throat, with swelling, pain; profuse flow of saliva from the mouth; (for sore throat in general, *Mercur. Jodat. Ruber* is preferable.) Toothache from decay, with aching, tearing pains, extending to the temples and glands, and a tendency to gum boils; Jaundice, yellowness of the skin and of the whites of the eyes; discharge from the ears, soreness, deafness; diarrhœa, frequent desire to relieve the bowels, preceeded by chilliness, with green, clay, or various colored, slimy and offensive, evacuations, especially the diarrhœa of infants and children; torpid liver, as shown by pale, fœtid and costive motions, dull pain in the right side, poor appetite, and dejection of spirits; syphilitic and scrofulous swellings of the glands in the groins.

2d. MERCURIUS CORROSIVUS.—Dysenteric affections, with tenesmus, burning pains in the abdomen, and discharge of blood and mucus; Gonorrhœa in the first stage, with sharp pain on urinating; syphilitic eruptions, etc.

Nux Vomica.—Constipation, with ineffectual desire for stool; Constipation alternating with relaxation; water-brash; heart-burn, flatulence; acute indigestion, with nausea and violent vomiting, headache, trembling hands, and other affections following intoxication. Dry coryza; irritable bladder, and spasmodic stricture, from abuse of alcohol. Affections resulting from sedentary habits; too close brain labor, anxiety and business cares, night-watching, indulgence at table, and the abuse of alcohol or tobacco. It is best adapted to persons of spare habit, firm fibre, and of energetic, irritable or hypochondriacal disposition, with tendency to irregular action of the bowels. and Piles.

**Phosphorus.**—Chiefly valuable in affections of the lungs. *Pneumonia*, chronic bronchitis, hoarseness; dry cough, or cough with expectoration of mucus, sometimes with blood; chronic cough; *Consumption*, in which it is of signal use, moderating the cough, diarrhœa and congestion of the lungs; chronic wasting, diarrhœa, and hectic; chronic inflammation of the stomach and bowels; malignant jaundice; fatty degeneration, in any part; typhus and other fevers, and want of vital reaction; also physical and nervous weakness from loss of animal fluids, especially from sexual excesses and self-abuse.

**Pulsatilla**.— Mucous Dyspepsia, nausea and vomiting of bile, mucus or of a bitter, sour fluid; indigestion from fat, pork, pastry, or other rich food; mucous diarrhœa, with little pain, chiefly at night; heart-burn. In the respiratory mucous membrane it is chiefly useful in catarrhal affections and sub-acute bronchitis, with much mucous discharge. Styes and other affections of the eye-lids. Deafness from catarrh, or following measles, with noises in the ears; ear-ache of chilMUNSON & Co's. HOMCEOPATHIC GUIDE, ST. LOUIS.

dren, with purulent discharge. For tardy or suppressed menstruation : leucorrhœa; deficient secretion of milk. It is also useful in swollen testicle, and other affections of the male organs.

**Rhus Toxicodendron.**—This remedy is chiefly used in *Rheumatism*, and in affections of the skin. Rheumatism; lumbago: sciatica; paralysis, from exposure of the back to damp and cold; vesicular erysipelas; chicken-pox; ringworm; shingles; scaldhead, etc.

Silicea. — Scrofulous ulcers; gumboil; glandular and lymphatic swellings; affections of bones [rickets]; housemaid's knee; ringworm; scabbed-head; whitlows; fœtid smell of the feet; leucorrhœa, etc. It promotes the kindly suppuration of abscesses of all kinds, and tends to moderate suppuration when it is excessive.

**Spongia.**—We have inserted this remedy in our list, not because it is in very frequent demand, but because it ought to be at hand whenever required.

Its grand use, alone, or more generally in turns with *Acon.*, is in croup, especially in the earliest stage, when it will frequently terminate an attack in a short time. It is also useful in dry, hard, barking cough, worse at night; hoarseness, with dry cough and obstructed breathing; croupy cough such as frequently precedes or follows croup.

**Sulphur.** — This drug has a specific action on the skin. In affections of the skin, it is indicated by an irritation or itching, which yields an agreeable sensation on scratching, and is aggravated by the warmth of bed; boils, preventively and curatively; chill.lains; whitlows; scald-head, and in many scrofulous affections. In affections of the mucous tract, *Sulph*. is chiefly required in those of the eyes, the urethra, and the rectum, as in strumous and catarrhal Ophthalmia; incontinence of urine; prolapsus of the womb; burning and itching of the anus; tapeworm; piles and chronic constipation.

Veratrum Album. — Autumnal diarrhœa, when vomiting is superadded to purging. Asiatic Cholera; diarrhœa and painful gripings; violent vomiting and purging. Cramps in the bowels or limbs; cold sweat and coldness of the whole body; black vomit; vomiting during pregnancy. It is often beneficial in the convulsive stage of hooping cough.

Veratrum Viride.—Fever with severe headache and brain symptoms, rapid pulse; remittent fever of infants; the invasive stage of scarlatina, measles, etc., with head symptoms, as above; erysipelas, especially the vesicular variety; here it may also be applied externally thirty drops of the strong tincture to half a pint of water; congestion of the head during teething; Pneumonia; etc. Inflamed corns, bunions, etc., may be touched with the strong tincture.

# HOW TO TREAT WOUNDS.

Wounds of the soft parts are of four kinds: Incised, made by clean cutting instruments; Punctured, such as pricks and stabs; Lacerated, the parts being torn, and the lips of the wounds irregular; and Contused, or bruised, the surface being broken.

TREATMENT — The following are the chief points: 1st. To arrest the bleeding. In most cases, the elevation of the bleeding parts, the application of cold, moderate pressure, and the coaptation of the edges, of the wound, after cleaning them, will suffice. A Calendula-lotion will serve to arrest hæmorrhage, and check suppuration. In severe wounds involving arteries, the parts should be laid open by a surgeon, and the wounded vessels ligatured. See also further on.

2d.— The removal of foreign bodies.—Dirt, hair, glass, clots of blood, etc., should be speedily removed by the fingers, forceps, or sponge and water

3d.—To bring the injured parts into nice apposition.—Any muscular fibres likely to prevent complete union should be relaxed or divided, and after the sides of the wound have been accurately adjusted, they must be kept so by strips of adhesive plaster, first applied to that side of the wound which is most movable, and then secured to the other, But in extensive wounds, where plaster would be insufficient, stitches should be employed.

4th.—*To promote adhesion.*—To secure this, the part should be kept at rest, and if the injury be severe, the patient should remain in bed.

5th.—When a wound is *dressed*, say once in every twenty-four hours, a sponge or rag should be wetted with warm water, and laid over the dressing, so that it may be removed without the risk of disturbing the surfaces which may have partially united, Often the lotion may be renewed by removing the oiled silk only, pouring a little lotion on the rag or lint, and then replacing the oiled silk.

6th.—Should a wound or bruise be followed by constitutional disturbance, fever, chills, and throbbing in the parts, medicines should be administered. Arnica (as prepared for internal use) and Aconitum will generally meet the requirements of such cases, and should be administered every one to three hours in alternation, for several times; Belladonna, pain and swelling of the injured part; Hepar Sulph., when suppuration is established, Silicea, unhealthy suppuration.

**HAMAMELIS TINCTURE.**—For external Piles or any bleeding surface this remedy is unequaled; also for varicose veins, Rheumatism and Gout, Bleeding of the Nose. It is also recommended for inhalation in bleeding of the lungs; a drachm of the tincture to a pint of hot water.

HYDRASTIS TINCTURE.—For Ulcers of all kinds, Cancerous Tumors; also, in Erysipelatous Inflammation, &c.

These Tinctures are all of full strength, prepared from *fresh Plants*, and should not be confounded with Tinctures prepared at regular Drug Stores. They are quite different.

In applying external Tinctures they should be diluted with water, in the proportion of one part of the Tincture to five or ten parts of water. In some instances, however, they may be applied in a less diluted form. It is not always necessary to remove the bandage or cloth with which the wound is covered, as the lotion may be poured on from time to time, in order that the wound be not unnecessarily disturbed.

The External Tinctures may also be used for *Domestic Animals* in similar complaints, and applied in the same manner.

## Directions for Ordering Goods, &c.

Goods can be sent to any part of the country by express and some articles by mail. It must be understood that we are not responsible for the safe delivery of goods sent through the mails, unless the package is registered, costing 10 cts. extra. When we send goods by express we take the companys receipt and can always look to them for lost goods, but if anything is lost in the mails it is a hard matter to get anything from the United States for it. Books generally go through the mail safely. The postage on them is one cent for every two ounces or fractional part thereof. The postage on any package of merchandise is one cent per ounce.
