# CURRICULUM FOR HOMŒOPATHIC STUDENTS

The Organon is the store-house of everything Homœo-pathic. We may expect that there must be some pointers to the curriculum for homœopathic students in the said work. If we read between the lines in Section 3 of it, as clarified by Secs. 4—7 and Sec. 186, we find that our expectation comes true.

What Hahnemann requires of the Physician, so that he is able to cure a case of disease, is enumerated in the said section in the following way:

- 1. Knowledge of Disease
- 2. Knowledge of Medicine
- 3. Choice of the remedy
- 4. Preparation of the remedy
- 5. Posology or dose
- 6. Repetition
- 7. Obstacles to recovery

These are the seven fibres that go to weave the whole texture of the Organon.

## KNOWLEDGE OF DISEASE

Disease refers to the opposite state of ease of the human organism. A perfect knowledge of disease entails a previous knowledge of the organism in ease, i.e., in its normalcy. The branch of study of the normal organism is divisible into two parts, e.g., Anatomy and Physiology, which deal with the normal

structure and normal functioning of the organism, respectively. Knowledge of disease proper refers to the causative factors of disease, its common, general, or particular symptoms, prognosis, diet and regimen. So this subject refers to the Practice of Medicine. Ætiology in Homœopathy differs to a consideraable extent from the Ætiology in Allopathy. So the study of the Homœopathic Ætiology refers to Hahnemann's conclusions in his works, the Organon and the Chronic Diseases. When Ætiology is purely of a mechanical, external and topical nature, calling for manipulation or operative surgery, or when the endproducts of disease are irreversible states, surgery becomes the relevent subject of study. Obstetrics is a branch of surgery, manipulative as well as operative, to which is allied the science of Gynæcology. Diseases have end-results which are conceived, rightly or wrongly, to be ætiological, again. So Pathology and Bacteriology legitimately form the subjects of study.

#### KNOWLEDGE OF MEDICINE

Knowledge of Medicine refers to the knowledge of the natural history, habitat, principle and method of collection, preservation and selection of parts, of the drugs, i.e., to Pharmacopæia. It refers, again, to its action upon the human organism, which may by nature be either toxicological or pharmacodynamic. So, knowledge of medicine refers to Pharmacopæia, Toxicology and Pharmacodynamics. Toxicology is in Allopathic Materia Medica and Pharmacodynamics, in the Homœopathic. Toxicology refers, again, to Medical Jurisprudence.

# OBSTACLES TO RECOVERY

The Obstacles refer to General Hygiene, and Hygiene peculiar to Homœopathy in the shape of Dietetics and the subject of regimen, as formulated by Hahnemann in his famous works, the Organon and the Chronic Diseases.

#### THE REST

The rest of the subjects from 3—6 are dealt with in the Homoeopathic Materia Medica, the Organon, and the work on the Chronic Diseases.

#### Conclusion

So, over and above the Homœopathic subjects dealt with in the (1) Materia Medica, (2) Organon, (3) Chronic Diseases, (4) Pharmacopæia, and (5) Repertory, the following medical subjects are the essentials of study for a Homœopathic student of the Degree course :-

- 1. Anatomy
- 6. Surgery 7. Pathology
- 2. Physiology 3. Practice of Medicine
- 8. Bacteriology
- Obstetrics
- 9. Medical Jurisprudence
- Gynæcology
- 10. Hygiene
- 11. Clinical knowledge in a Hospital.

# POST GRADUATE STUDIES

The above subjects should form the curriculum for a fouror five-year degree course in a homeopathic medical college. But, as the four or five years of study are not sufficient to furnish a homeopathic student completely with all that is to be known in Homœopathy, a Post-graduate course of studies for two years, consisting of the following subjects, should be offered: --

- 1. Materia Medica—Higher studies (Materia Medica Pura, Chronic Diseases, Guidings Symptoms, Encyclopædia, Cyclopædia of Drug Pathogenesy).
- Repertory (Bænninghausen, Kent, and Card Repertotories).
- Homeopathic Philosophy (Kent, J. H. Allen, Stuart Close, Roberts, Wheeler, Otto Leeser, August Bier).
- Pharmacopæia (Complete of U.S.A.).
- Modern Homocopathic Researches--(Abraham, Stearns, Patterson, Bier, Kolisko, Boyd, Twentyman, Templeton, Foubister, Grimmer, Boericke, Mackenzie, Gutman, Stephenson).
- Clinical Studies and Statistics in a homœopathic hospital.

## ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility to the Post-Graduate Course should be graduation from a recognised Homœopathic Medical College, or from any other college with the additional qualification of a diploma of Degree Course in the homœopathic subjects from a recognized Institution. Homœopathy can not be relegated to the Post-graduate Studies alone.
