Introduction

Dr. S.C. Ghose of West Bengal conducted short proving of this drug on few provers and mentioned it in Drugs of Hindoosthan.

The CCRH undertook separate proving of Embelia ribes in the year 1994 at D.P.R.U, Calcutta and RRI, New Delhi. Proving pathogenesis of Embelia ribes thus evolved was put to Clinical Verification.

Throughtout India.

Part used for preparation of Homoeopathic medicine

Description

It is large scandent shrub; branches long, sender, flexible, terate with long internodes; the bark studded with lenticels. Leaves coriaceous, 5-9 by 2-3.8 cm, elliptic or elliptic- lanceolate, shortly and obtusely acuminate, entire, glabrous on both sides, shining above, paler and somewhat silvery beneath, the whole surface covered with

minute reddish sunken glands; base rounded; petioles 6-16 mm long, glabrous; Flowers pentamerous, numerous, small in lax, panicled racemes which are terminal and from the upper axils; branches of the penicle 7.5-10 cm. long, bracts minute, Calyx about 1.25 mm long, sepals connate. Petals 5, greenish yellow, free, 4 m long, elliptic, sub-obtuse; Stamens 5, shorter than petals; Fruits are spherical about 4 mm in diameter, vary in colour from red to nearly black; warty. shortly pedicillate, with a persistent calyx. The pericarp is brittle and encloses a reddish seed, which is covered with thin membrane; on removing this, the seed is covered with light spots. Seed is depressed at the base and has a horny and slightly ruminated endosperm 1.

Note:

- i) The symptoms super scribed with a particular number (1,2,3,4,) are found in the literature, as well as clinically verified by CCRH.
- New symptoms superscribed (N) observed only during the course of clinical verification study, but not found in the literature.

The picture, given below is drawn from the data obtained during the course of clinical verification study. To make the data more reliable, those symptoms found relieved in more than 30 patients, after the use of the medicine, are only incorporated in the following drug picture.

- ♦ Morose, fretful²
- ♦ Irritable ^{2,4}
- ♦ Whitish patches on face N
- ♦ Coryza with thin nasal discharge 5
- Pricking & itching sensation in nostrils²
- ◆ Grinding of teeth at night in sleep^{2,3,4}
- ◆ Grinding of teeth at night in sleep with excessive salivation N
- ♦ Loss of appetite 5
- ♦ Ravenous hunger ^{2,3}
- ◆ Craving for indigestable articles^N, sweet^N
- ♦ Nausea³
- Cramping pain in abdomen around naval ⁵,
 Intermittent ⁵, <after eating ⁴, >after passing stool ⁵, passing flatus⁴
- Flatulence⁵ with distension of abdomen > passing flatus ⁴

- ◆ Pain in abdomen (in umbilical region) with loose stool & pin worms^{2,3} > after passing stool ^{3,4}

- ◆ Loose stool <after eating N</p>
- ◆ Pin worms pass in stool 2,3 after taking medicine
