

POSTERIOR PITUITARY GLAND

Material

The tincture triturate was used, Boericke and Tafel, two pills each three hours.

Method

A proving of the Posterior Pituitary Gland was made by the Hering Proving Committee of the Hahnemann Medical School in Philadelphia and reported in the *Pacific Coast Journal of Homœopathy* but the results of the proving were not abstracted and published as such. An attempt to do this has been made in the schema which follows, based on that of Kent's Repertory. Only symptoms which were reported by at least two of the provers have been listed. No attempt was made to evaluate the symptoms by their relative success in clinical application of the newly reported symptoms.

Head, pain, occiput
 extending downwards
Bladder, urination frequent
 retarded
Skin, dry
 hair, falling
