SOME SIMILES AND METAPHORS

In the following similes and metaphors great truths are succinctly and graphically expressed. A fund of information is enclosed in a nut-shell and the facts thus described leave an indelible impression on the mind.

Aconite: "Aconite is styled the 'Homœopathic Lancet' for it has put an end to blood-letting by the relief it gave in inflammatory conditions like pleurisy, pneumonia etc. where blood-letting was considered imperative."

Aconite fever—"It is a great storm and is soon over." Dr. C. Dunham.

Aconite disease—"The great storm of the fully developed Aconite disease is a 'tempest in the tea pot'." Dr. W. Gutman.

Alumina: "Alumina is the 'Aconite of chronic diseases'." Dr. H. C. Allen.

Antim. Tart.: "The Antim. Tart. patient is the 'death-rattle' patient."

Argentum Nit.: "Argentum Nitricum globules are known as the 'Funk pills'."

"Argentum Nitricum is represented by the 'played-out actor, who, panic-stricken within, finds excuses for all his shortcomings'." Dr. Edward Whitmont.

Arsenicum Album: Arsenicum Album patient is the 'goldheaded—cane patient'."

"Arsenicum personality type has been likened to a 'race

Arsenicum album is the 'Homœopathic trocar'."

Asafoetida: The loud eructations of Asafoetida are like a 'popgun' going off almost every second. Dr. M. L. Tylor.

Belladonna: "The child is very hot, with red face and semistupor, but every little while starts and jumps in sleep as if it might go into spasms. This condition is often found

in children and then Belladonna is like 'oil upon troubled waters'." Dr. M. L. Tyler.

Bellis Per: "The Daisy is our 'English Arnica'." Dr. M. L. Tyler.

Bryonia: The Bryonia patient, "'like a bear chewing his paws', he wants to be left alone." Dr. Edward Whitmont.

Calcarea: "The typical Calcarea patient may be likened to an 'oyster without a shell'; he represents a helpless, flabby organism lacking in inner organization and outer defence." Dr. Edward Whitmont.

Carbo Veg.: Carbo Veg. is a veritable 'corpse reviver'."

Chamomilla: "Chamomilla has been called the 'opium of Homoeopathy' as it is so successful in calming these nerve storms." Dr. Petrie Hoyle.

China: "That it (China) caused a febrile paroxysm was the 'Newton's apple' which led him (Hahnemann) to formulate Similia Similibus as the law of specific therapeutics." Dr. R. Hughes.

"If the depletion has been sudden, as from a haemorrhage from the womb, lungs, bowels or nose, there will be faintness, loss of weight, ringing in the ears etc. For this state of things we have a 'friend indeed' in China." Dr. E. B. Nash.
