ELIMINATING RUBRICS

DR. PHYLLIS SPEIGHT

Finding the similar remedy is not as easy as it sounds and great skill is needed to match the symptoms of the patient to those of the remedy.

When you find a symptom that is very strongly marked in your patient, this same symptom must be as strongly marked in the remedy; in other words it must appear in thick black type in Kent's Repertory. When you have taken a case with a number of symptoms and you are ready to repertorise it, it is of tremendous help if among the symptoms you have taken you find one of the following rubrics which is *strongly* marked; then this rubrics can be used as an eliminating symptom.

I have been through the first and last sections of the Repertory (the two most important) and I have listed rubrics with only a very few remedies, and in each case one remedy is in Italic type.

If these can be memorised they will be a great help as "eliminating" rubrics and will save much time in finding the similar remedy.
