Providence had its say when it thwarted him in his ambition to become a Surgeon and eventually Homocopathy gained a stalwart in his person.

He established the Homoeopathic Post Graduate Association, Bombay in 1931 and remained the President of the same till the last day of his life.

He was one of the members of the Homocopathic Enquiry Committee appointed by the Government of India in 1948. He continued to be in the Advisory Committee subsequently until his staunch advocacy of a definite programme for the establishment of proper training institutions all over the country proved inconvenient to those in power.

With him Homeopathy in India has lost a great genius and an honest combatant.

May his soul rest in Eternal Peace!
