

COMMENT

We thankfully received from the *Saurashtra Homœopathic Medical Association*, Rajkot, its Annual Report for the year 1960. From this report we find that the Association is continuing its strenuous activities for the following aims and objects :—

(1) To bring about unity and co-operation amongst all the Homœopathic Practitioners of the State.

(2) To establish and maintain the rights and privileges of Medical Practitioners under this system.

(3) To obtain status and dignity for them in accordance with the other systems of medicine.
