HOMŒOPATHY IN SURGERY

Maheswar Jha of 13, a student of local school Muzaffarpur, while playing foot-ball in February, 1949, was hurt in his left leg. Two-days later he felt pain. The left leg was swollen. On Basant Panchami he was groaning. Dr. Manooj Babu, an allopath gave him some relief. After that he was taken to several allopaths but of no help. The left leg was emaciated and curved. One year later, in 1950, he was taken to Dr. Banerjee, the renowned surgeon and physician of the regular school at Darbhanga. He was x'rayed and told that there had been caries in bone and if not controlled, amputation would be the only remedy. Plaster was administered. Having been plastered he was sent home. Hardly a month had passed when pus over-flowed. He was brought back to Dr. Banerjee at Darbhanga, when after re-x-ray plaster was administered once again. A number of such repetitions took place in course of 2 years and a half. And thereafter he was declared cured. After six months again pus over-flowed. This time again he was advised plaster by his physician. Financial position of the boy could not permit it to be done. Under this helpless condition, I was asked to treat the boy. A few doses of Arnica and Silicea radically cured the boy and he is alright for over four years.
