The Merck Manual, 13th edition (page 1531) 1981:

Manic-depressive illness: Since Lithium (as the carbonate or citrate) usually controls mania after 5 to 10 days. The initial dosage of lithium carbonate is 500mg, t.i.d. orally. Daily adjustments can be made to produce a serum lithium level of 0.8 to 1.5 mEq/L. Once a satisfactory plasma concentration is achieved, the scrum lithium level must be checked only every 3 months. Early side-effects of Lithium include fine tremor, polyuria, nausea and diarrhoea; coarse tremor, persistent nausea with vomiting, drowsiness, and ataxia, goitre.
